METHODOLOGY:

The sample size for the survey is 602 likely voters and the margin of error is +/-3.99%. The Interactive Voice Response (IVR) automated telephone survey was conducted July 26-29, 2014 by Harper Polling. The total percentages for responses may not equal 100% due to rounding.
