






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Members are only marginally aware of the initiative. They are somewhat more familiar with the name TEI than with The Margins Tax.


The Education Initiative is overwhelmingly popular across the NSEA membership


I would like to read you a measure that will appear on the Nevada ballot in November called [The Education Initiative, or T.E.I. / The Margins Tax].

"This measure would establish a two percent tax on business revenue. Only companies that have more than a million dollars in revenue will pay the tax. Businesses can deduct either the costs of goods sold or employee salaries and benefits.

All funds from this tax would be dedicated to Nevada's K-12 public schools. The estimated fiscal impact is \$600 million in revenue generated each year."


If the election were held today, would you vote for or against this measure?





How much, if anything, have you heard about <u>criticisms</u> of this ballot measure?








NSEA members overwhelmingly believe state funding for public schools should be increased. A more modest 58% majority are aware of recent cuts to state education funding.

Our positive messaging for TEI proves highly persuasive among NSEA members – particularly when crafted in terms of populist and opportunity themes


Let me read you reasons people have given to vote for this ballot measure to create a business margins tax to increase funding for public schools. How convincing is each one?






After hearing three positive messages for TEI, member support for the initiative rises slightly – particularly among those who say they will 'definitely' vote for it




NSEA member favor the Democrats for state legislature by a ratio of slightly less than 2-to-1

If the November election for state legislature were held today, would you vote for the Democratic candidate or the Republican candidate for state legislature?



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
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
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If the election were held today, would you vote for or against this measure?
